



The Guided Training Handbook

Introduction

This is the **Guided Training Handbook** of The Crucified Way Ministry. It provides essential information for participating in the Guided Training program, which draws from lectures of the **Crucified Leadership Training Conference (CLtC)** and outreach directives and strategies from the **Save-A-Youth Movement (SAYM)**.

- Joining cohorts of Guided Training throughout the year
- Participating in the training sequence
- Stipulations and expectations for participation
- Expected outcomes after each cohort
- How to seek assistance for technical issues or spiritual challenges during the training

Duration and Cohorts

The Guided Training operates in structured cohorts, each spanning a two-month period:

- **Cohort #1:** January & February
- **Cohort #2:** March & April
- **Cohort #3:** May & June
- **Cohort #4:** July & August
- **Cohort #5:** September & October
- **Cohort #6:** November & December

Training sessions are held on **Fridays and Saturdays**:

Fridays:

- 09:00 – 12:00 (WAT/GMT+1)
- 16:00 – 18:00 (WAT/GMT+1)

Saturdays:

- 09:00 – 11:00 (WAT/GMT+1)
- 12:00 – 14:00 (WAT/GMT+1)

The initial weeks of each cohort focus on the **Crucified Leadership Training Conference (CLtC)** lectures, aimed at developing personal and functional sensitivity to the Voice of LORD through relationship in spirit and in truth. The remaining weeks emphasise outreach and active service through the **Save-A-Youth Movement (SAYM)**, applying spiritual growth to soul-winning.

Specific Guidelines for Schedule:

- All times are in West Africa Time (WAT) or GMT+1.
- Sessions are broadcasted or conducted strictly within these windows.

Procedure for Participation

To participate effectively:

- Registration must be completed **before the start of the cohort** via the dedicated form on the Ministry website.
- Upon successful registration, participants receive a unique **Training Code** and a personal **Training Profile** for access and instructions.
- All primary instructions are provided on the personal training page.
- In rare cases (e.g., urgent updates), instructions may be sent via email.
- The **Training Code** grants access to the Training Channel for live broadcasts and study materials.
- Training Codes are personal; sharing or duplicate usage is strictly prohibited and will result in immediate revocation of access.
- Codes are active only during scheduled training days and times.

- Special concessions for **onsite participation** may be granted upon prior application and approval. Approved onsite participants will receive specific instructions on their training page.

Sequence of Participation

The training follows a structured flow:

- Lectures are primarily delivered on **Saturdays**.
- Participants must submit a **report of understanding** on or by **Wednesday** following each lecture.
- Reports should include:
 - Personal insights and understanding
 - Practical applications
 - Any challenges encountered or overcome
 - Questions for clarification or further explanation
- **Fridays** are dedicated to discussions based on submitted reports.
- Progression to subsequent sessions depends on the leading of the Holy Ghost, informed by report assessments.

Course Expectations

Participants are expected to:

- Possess proficiency in English (speaking, listening, reading, and writing), as it is the primary language of instruction. Updates on provisions for other languages will be communicated as available.
- Demonstrate devotion and commitment to scheduled dates and times, with prompt communication in cases of inability to attend.
- Actively apply CLtC and SAYM principles for personal spiritual transformation.
- Maintain balance between spiritual development (CLtC) and outreach application (SAYM).
- Utilise no more than **two rebroadcast opportunities** per cohort.
- During SAYM weeks, establish **FAMILIES** (small cells) to replicate received values in others, submitting progress reports on these groups.

Assistance and Special Aid

The Ministry provides dedicated support:

- For technical difficulties: Email technical_support@crucifiedway.org
- For general training enquiries or clarifications: Email training@crucifiedway.org
- **Voice Clinic**: Confidential sessions for challenges related to hearing/communicating with the Voice of LORD (available only *after* relevant lectures). Sessions may be used for joint cohort case studies only with explicit permission.
- **i-Rescue**: A rapid-response tool for on-the-ground challenges during SAYM outreach activities. Ministers may be assigned as needed.

The Guided Training of The Crucified Way Ministry is divinely instituted to equip and empower willing individuals with spiritual growth for a deeper personal relationship with GOD and effective outreach to souls in need of repentance and salvation.
